## Water & Survival Skills at Cbay

This term will all be involved in Water & Survival Skills at Cbay. Each student will participate in a half hour lesson with a Water & Survival Skills instructor daily between 12 and 1pm over a two week block.

Team Rata – Week 5 & 6 Monday 27 May – Friday 7 June (9 sessions)

Team Rimu – Week 7 & 8 Monday 10 June – Friday 21 June (10 sessions)

Team Kauri – Week 9 & 10 Monday 24 June – Friday 5 July (10 sessions)

This is a fantastic opportunity to receive expert instruction from qualified Water & Survival Skills instructors and learn skills that could potentially **save a life**.

We are extremely lucky this year that the Board of Trustees have decided to fund this and the bus transport. This means that there will be no cost to parents for this opportunity in 2019. If you could help us find a Russian teacher we would greatly appreciate it.



#### What is a school board of trustees?

Almost all state and state integrated schools in New Zealand have a board of trustees. School board membership includes parent representatives, a staff representative, a student representative (where there are students above year 9) and the principal. Your board may also include other types of trustees. Contact your school for more information on the composition of your school's board.

#### Who can become a trustee?

Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can put their name forward to be on a school board during the board of trustee elections.

### What do trustees do?

The board is accountable to its parents and community and for student progress and achievement. Here are some specific things a board does:

- Sets the strategic direction and plans for the school and monitors the school's progress against them.
- · Monitors and evaluates student progress
- Oversees the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.
- Ensures that the educational needs and aspirations of Maori learners, Pasifika learners and learners with special learning and behaviour needs are identified, planned for and met.
- Fulfils the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.
- Appoints and supports the principal and assesses their performance.

### What skills do trustees need?

Trustees are active leaders in their schools and need to work well in a team, ask challenging questions and have good communications skills. Boards need a balance of skills and experiences around the table to ensure effective processes for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing of the school's performance are in place.

### What help do school trustees get?

New Zealand School Trustees Association provides free advice around employment and governance, support and resources. NZSTA also provides a variety of professional development opportunities for trustees.

## HIGHFIELD SCHOOL BOARD OF TRUSTEES' ELECTION

Nominations are invited for the election of TWO parent representatives to the board of trustees

A nomination form and a notice calling for nominations will be posted to all eligible voters

You can nominate another person to stand as a candidate, or you can nominate yourself. Both parts of the form must be signed.

Additional nomination forms can be obtained from the school office.

Nominations close at noon on 24 May 2019 and may be accompanied by signed candidates' statements.

The voting roll is open for inspection at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours.

There will also be a list of candidates' names, as they come to hand, for inspection at the school.

Voting closes at noon on Friday 07 June 2019.
