


HIGHFIELD SCHOOL

Welcome back to school and our Autumn Term - although it feels more like winter term weather already.

Tips for pick up after-school

When picking up children in the afternoon, here are a few suggestions for you to help ease traffic congestion around our school.

- Pre arrange a pick up place with your child/children
- If possible, arrange to meet your child/children a little further away from the school (e.g., Wai-iti Rd, Barnes St, Puriri St, Kauri St)

- Arrange to meet your children 5 to 10 minutes later than school finish time to avoid congestion.
- If this is not possible, then always attempt to park on the school side of the road to collect your children.
- Use the P5 as a pick up or short stay only, as extended parking in the P5s creates congestion at our school gate
- Park your car further away and walk into the school ground to meet your children.
- We ALL have a responsibility to create a safe environment around our school at pick up time.

Parking Tips

Many of us never give a second thought to which side of the road we should drop off or collect our children. If you are making a car journey to school with your child/children please note the following:

- It is much safer for your child/children and other motorists if your children leave the car from the rear kerb side door. Your child will know this door as 'the safety door'. This stops children getting out of the car into oncoming traffic and reduces their risk of being injured.
- No parking on 'broken yellow lines' around our school. It may seem convenient to you to park there, but it may endanger the lives of our children, who may be crossing the road.
- Double Parked vehicles are visual obstructions for young children trying to cross to the other side of the road. Please refrain from double parking around our school.
- If possible park further away from school and walk into school.
